POSITION OVERVIEW

This position operates within Council's Natural Areas team and is responsible for the coordination of Council's Bushfire management program ensuring that Council achieves best practice bushfire risk management, and meets the objectives of the Hunters Hill, Lane Cove and Ryde Bushfire Risk Management Plan.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Role Specific

- To plan an annual hazard reduction program in coordination with internal and external stakeholders.
- Manage Asset Protection Zones and associated contractors that contribute to managing bushfire hazards on Council management lands.
- Implement the actions of the Hunters Hill Lane Cove Parramatta Ryde Bushfire Risk Management Plan and represent Council on the Hunters Hill Lane Cove Parramatta Ryde Bushfire Risk Management Committee.
- Respond to customer requests regarding bushfire issues and coordinate and implement appropriate response and actions in accordance with Council's policies and strategic direction.
- Develop and review procedures and practices related to bushfire management to reflect changing industry standards and policies.
- Ensure capacity to deliver Council's hazard reduction program is maintained and enhanced, through Council staff development and training programs, key agency and landholder partnerships and through engagement and management of contractors.
- Prepare media responses (for approval) as they relate to bushfire management of Council-managed land.
- Seek and coordinate grant funding opportunities and applications to assist in the delivery of bushfire management actions.

Baseline

- Ensure that all practices are up to date with current and pertinent legislation, statutory regulations and better practice to ensure a subject-matter-expert mindset is adopted and promoted to all stakeholders.
- Promote continuous improvement and innovation in practices, optimisation of technology, procedures
 and recommendations with the aim of providing better service to the client base in line with the
 organisation's values.



- Build in performance metrics and mechanisms to identify early visibility of risks to enable mitigation approaches.
- Promote and maintain effective relationships with all external business partners including community organisations, contractors, State and Federal authorities.

- Demonstrated experience in developing and delivering community education and awareness programs related to bushfire management.
- Demonstrated experience in bushfire planning and hazard management (including management of contractors).
- Demonstrated experience in the development, implementation and review of strategies and policies.
- Demonstrated experience in preparing and reviewing Part 5 (REF) Assessments.
