POSITION OVERVIEW

The Senior Producer is responsible for working with the developing, producing, and delivering the National Theatre of Parramatta (NTofP)'s creative program of productions and projects, with a key focus on driving creative excellence, commercial viability, audience engagement, and ticket sales outcomes. This role leads project implementation and provides producing leadership for both Riverside-based seasons and touring programs, while supporting the strategic and financial goals of NTofP. During the interim operation it will be producing NTofP *Live at PHIVE* program, A 200 seat temporary venue situated in PHIVE's Discovery space. The venue will operate as Riverside's interim home during the development of its permanent precinct.

The National Theatre of Parramatta (NTofP) is Riverside Theatres' flagship professional theatre company, rooted in Western Sydney and driven to create bold, culturally resonant work. It champions new Australian voices through major productions, commissions, coproductions and touring initiatives. Focused on artistic excellence, audience accessibility and sustainable commercial growth, NTofP aims to become a nationally recognised theatre enterprise.

This role supports the Executive and Creative Producer (EP/CP) to deliver and implement NTofP programs and productions internally and externally and plays a pivotal role in promoting Riverside Theatres as a centre of excellence in performing arts, events and exhibitions in Western Sydney region.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Role Specific



- Provide end-to-end producing leadership and delivery of productions and projects —ensuring timely and professionally delivered contracting, scheduling, budgeting (in consultation with the EP/CP), technical planning, delivery and post-production evaluation for NTofP.
- Collaborate with the Executive & Creative Producer and future Artistic Director by providing advice and industry knowledge to help shape the annual programming strategy, content selection, and curatorial direction for consideration.
- Lead financial modelling for productions including cost recovery, co-producing structures, ticket yield targets, and income forecasting.
- Oversee project delivery using contemporary project management practices—ensuring productions are delivered on time, on budget and to the highest standards.
- In consultation with EP/CP be the lead in developing and driving box office and ticketing strategies
 in collaboration with marketing and ticketing teams, including onsale planning, pricing, allocation
 management, and revenue reporting.
- Manage all technical and production elements in collaboration with the Production and Technical teams, from set and sound to lighting and staging logistics.
- In consultation with the EP/CP supervise and mentor junior producers and trainees as part of Riverside's sector development and skills pipeline.
- Establish and maintain clear production procedures and records systems, including reporting, contracting, archiving and risk management in line with Councils processes and procedures.
- Maintain strong client and partner relationships, including negotiation of supplier agreements, creative contracts, venue partnerships, and co-producing arrangements in accordance with Council's procurement policy and procedures.
- Represent NTofP at pitch events, industry forums and public events, promoting the company's artistic and commercial vision, and foster a positive reputation and outcomes for City of Parramatta.
- Attend and participate in company meetings, funding submissions, and acquittals as required.
- In consultation with the EP/CP, coordinate touring productions and manage relationships with national and international partners, venues and consortia.
- Ensure effective management of sets, props and production assets, including storage, asset tracking, and reuse where appropriate to ensure sustainable practices.

Baseline

- Support and assist the EP/CP in the training of new casual staff.
- Ensure that all practices are up to date with current and pertinent legislation, statutory
 regulations and better practice to ensure a subject-matter-expert mindset is adopted and
 promoted to all stakeholders.
- Promote continuous improvement and innovation in practices, optimisation of technology, procedures and recommendations with the aim of providing better service to the client base in line with the organisation's values.
- Build in performance metrics and mechanisms to identify early visibility of risks to enable mitigation approaches.
